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Welty Building Company Releases Bowery Project Economic Impact Report: \$245 Million and more than 2,000 Jobs in Summit County over 20 years

September 19, 2019 – *Akron, OH* – Welty Building Company, the City of Akron, and the Bowery Development Group announced today the exciting results of the Economic Impact Report for the Bowery Project. The Bowery will generate \$245 million in economic impact and more than 2,000 jobs in Summit County over 20 years, with \$44 million and 400 jobs created during the first five years. Every \$1 of the \$42 million investment in the project will result in \$6 in total output. The largest impact of the project stems from redeveloping prime real estate in downtown Akron, the economic center of the greater Akron area—creating new retail, office space, and housing in currently unutilized areas.

The Bowery project is a \$42-million restoration and rehabilitation of six historic, downtown Akron buildings into a mixed-use residential, office and retail complex. Apartments ranging from studios to three-bedroom units are now are available for lease, and more information is available at http://www.bowerydistrict.com. The project is on track and is scheduled for completion on November 29th.

Earlier this year, Welty Building Company commissioned the study with Dr. Amanda L. Weinstein of the Department of Economics at the University of Akron, and Doctors Nadia Greehalgh-Stanley and Shawn Rohlin of the Department of Economics at Kent

State University. The IMPLAN (Impact Analysis for Planning) methodology was used to measure the direct, indirect, and induced effects on the Summit County economy from both construction as well as revenue generated from apartments and office and retail space.

"The findings of this study verify what we have been saying from day one—the Bowery Project is a truly catalytic endeavor that will help usher in the next wave of private investment in downtown Akron," remarked Akron Mayor Dan Horrigan "Better yet, we can expect to see substantial benefits to the community within the next 5 years, which is even sooner than we could have hoped."

"The study confirms that the investment we are making in Akron will have a positive impact on the city for decades to come, said Don Taylor, President and CEO of Welty Building Company. "The Bowery will not only help revitalize downtown but also help Akron businesses attract and retain the quality employees they need to succeed by providing the urban housing and entertainment opportunities that is important to today's workforce."
